


Public Interested Person Registration

Although electronic filing is available only to attorneys, other public users, such as self-represented parties and members of the media, can register for limited access to CM/ECF, which will allow for registering for electronic notification of docket activity in individual cases.

1. Register for Public Interested Person Access


- a. Go to http://www.pacer.gov.
- b. Select **Register** from the menu bar, then **Start**.
- c. Select E-File and/or Attorney Admissions.
- d. Select **U.S. Appellate Courts** as the Court Type and **U.S. Court of Appeals**, **Federal Circuit** as the Court, then **Next**.
- e. Select one of the options based on the type of PACER account you have and your electronic filing history. If you have never filed electronically with the Federal Circuit, you will eventually reach the following screen:



f. Select Non-Attorney.



g. Complete the fields on the E-File Registration Page and click Next.

Delivery Method and Formatting

- Select how frequently and in what format you wish to receive email notifications. You can also add additional emails to receive notice in Additional Email Addresses.
- h. On the next screen, select your payment options for PACER and other fees, then click **Next**.
- i. Review the E-Filing Terms of Use and click the acknowledgements.
- Click Submit. You will receive electronic notification once your request has been processed.

Note: Please allow two to three business days for processing by the Clerk's Office.



2. Check the Status of Your Request

After submitting your request for e-filing access or for government admission to practice, you can check online for the status of your request.

- a. Go to http://www.pacer.gov.
- b. Click Manage My Account at the top of the screen.
- c. Log on using your PACER credentials (if not already logged on)
- d. Under the **Maintenance** tab, select **Check E-File Status** to review the status of your registration.



e. Click Check next to the Federal Circuit.
