## ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint concerning a district court judge of the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.

A complaint concerning a district court judge must be filed with the court of appeals for the regional circuit within which the district court is included, i.e., the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Rule 7(a)(1) of the Rules for Judicial Conduct and Judicial Disability Proceedings (a complaint against United States district court judge "must be filed with the circuit clerk in the jurisdiction in which the subject judge holds office"). Thus, dismissal of the complaint filed with this court is required pursuant to Rule 11(c)(1)(F).
