## ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant has filed a document which we construe to be a judicial misconduct complaint concerning a judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit.

A complaint concerning a judge of a court of appeals must be filed with the circuit clerk for the circuit in which the judge holds office, i.e., the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. Rule 7(a)(1) (a complaint against a judge of a court of appeals “must be filed with the circuit clerk in the jurisdiction in which the subject judge holds office”). Thus, dismissal of the complaint filed with this court is required pursuant to Rule 11(c)(1)(F).

The complaint is dismissed.
