ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint concerning a judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims. To the extent the complainant also asserts wrongdoing by other individuals, we do not accept the complaint against those individuals. Rule 8(c), (d) of the Rules for Judicial Conduct and Judicial Disability Proceedings (court may only accept a complaint against a person covered by the rules).

A complaint concerning a judge of the Court of Federal Claims must be filed with the Court of Federal Claims. Rule 7(a)(2) (a complaint against a judge of the Court of Federal Claims must be filed with the clerk of that court). Thus, dismissal of the complaint filed with this court is required pursuant to Rule 11(c)(1)(F).

The complaint is dismissed.
