ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint concerning a judge of this court.

In a declaration attached to the complaint, the complainant states that the judge and "the Judicial Conference Committee have violated my Statutory, Civil, Constitutional, and Human Rights by allowing Federal Judges to commit crimes and by refusing to address my Petitions for Review in violation of 28 USC §331." No further explanation is provided.

Pursuant to Rule 11(c)(1)(D), the complainant's assertion is dismissed because it is "based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred."

The complaint is dismissed.
