ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant filed a document which we initially construed to be a possible judicial misconduct complaint concerning a judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims. The complainant recently responded, indicating that he was not attempting to file a complaint with this court but instead was asking for this court's review of the order of the Chief Judge for the Court of Federal Claims, which had dismissed his complaint lodged there.

This court does not have authority to review the order of the Chief Judge of the Court of Federal Claims. Instead, as noted in that Chief Judge's dismissal order, review could be requested by the entire court of the Court of Federal Claims. *See also* 28 U.S.C. § 363 (noting that the Court of Federal Claims shall have the authority of a Judicial Council for matters related to complaints of judicial misconduct).

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The matter is dismissed as filed with the wrong court.
