The Yankton Sioux Tribe moves without opposition to stay the briefing schedule in this appeal pending disposition of <u>Tohono O'odham Nation v. United States</u>, 2008-5043.

The Tribe states that this appeal and <u>Tohono O'odham</u> involve a similar issue, i.e., whether the Tribe's suit in the United States Court of Federal Claims for money damages is barred pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1500 because of a suit filed in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia. The Tribe states that the court's decision in <u>Tohono O'odham</u> will likely control the outcome of this appeal.

Upon consideration thereof,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) The motion to stay the briefing schedule is granted. The Tribe is directed to notify this court within 14 days of the issuance of the mandate in <u>Tohono O'odham</u>, concerning how it believes this appeal should proceed. The United States may also respond within that time.
- (2) A copy of this order shall be transmitted to the merits panels assigned to Tohono O'odham, to inform that panel of this related appeal.
