## ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed complaints of judicial misconduct against three judges of this court who served on a merits panel that decided his appeal. For the following reasons, the misconduct complaints are dismissed.

Complainant alleges that the subject judges “upheld the errors” of the trial court that were “not supported by any facts or evidence.” Complainant further contends that the subject judges’ decision in his appeal was “not based upon the findings of fact and conclusions of law.” These allegations directly challenge the merits of the judges’ ruling and, as such, are not cognizable misconduct and must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); *see also* Rule 4(b)(1) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings (“Cognizable misconduct does not include an allegation that calls into question the correctness of a judge’s ruling[.]”); Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

Complainant also alleges that the subject judges’ ruling “showed prejudice to a pro se litigant.” However, adverse rulings are not proof of misconduct. And Complainant has provided no objectively verifiable evidence to support this allegation. As such, the allegation “lack[s] sufficient evidence to raise an inference that

misconduct has occurred” and must be dismissed.  
§ 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); *see also* Rule 11(c)(1)(D).

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The complaints are dismissed.
